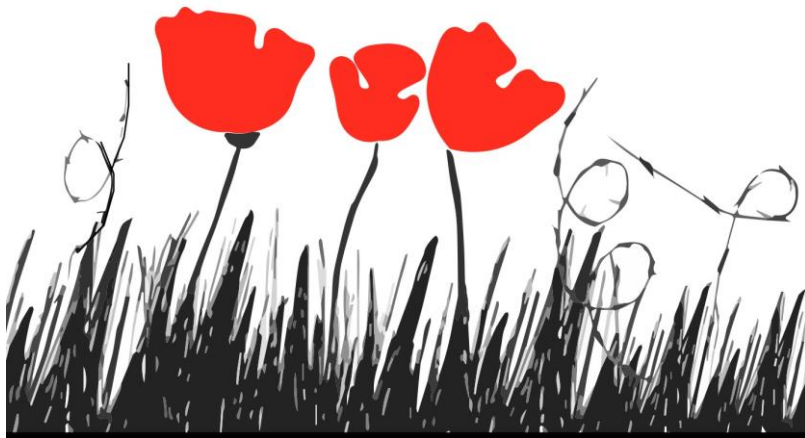
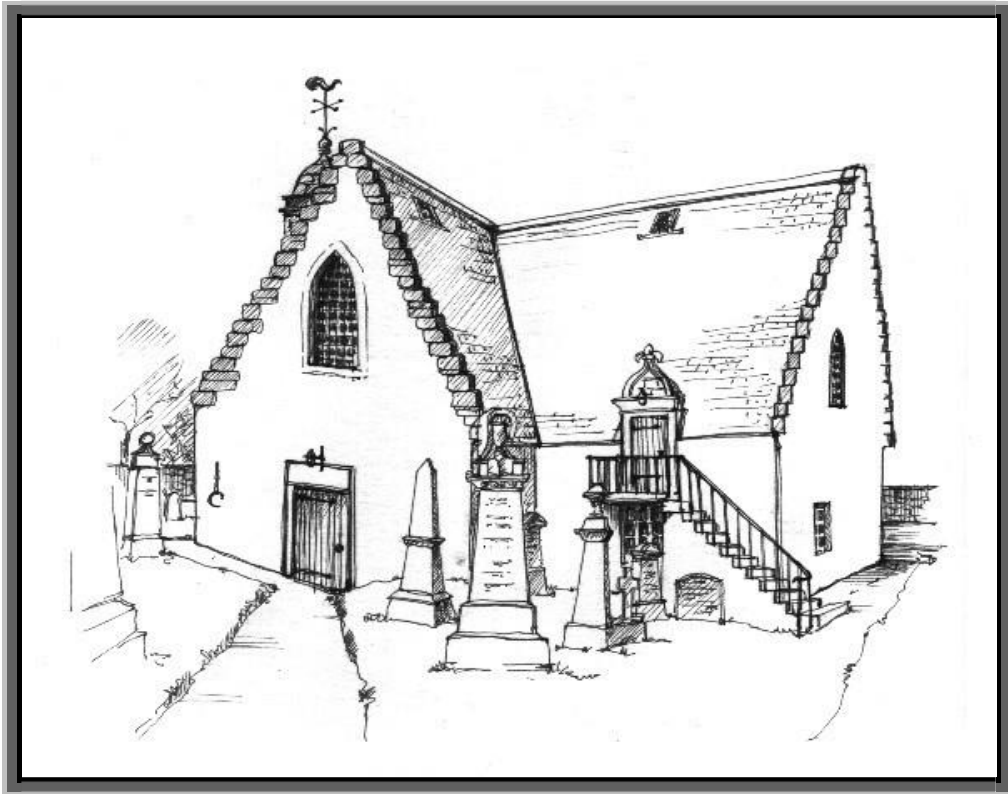

Dear Friends

'November chill blows loud wi' angry sugh

The short'ning winter day is near a close'

So begins the story of *The Cottar's Saturday Night* by Robert Burns and one of my favourite poems. I like the poem because it recounts rural family life and his description of the darkening winter evening is atmospheric and evocative of our experience of winter here in the Fenwick parish area.

November is a month devoted to remembering and this year is no different. 'Remember, remember, the 5th of November' is the saying. This year the 5th of November is the date of the celebration of Holy Communion, the sacrament which the church celebrates as a congregation and worshipping community. All who love the Lord are welcome to join in this special meal of bread and wine together, there is no requirement to be a member of the congregation. We know that there are people and families in the village and in Waterside and Moscow who have come to live in our communities and you are welcome to share with us in this celebration.

In the celebration of Holy Communion, we recognise and acknowledge all that Jesus did to win our salvation and reconcile us with God. In drinking the wine and eating the bread, we recreate Jesus serving bread and wine to his disciples, trying to explain to them what must be done to deal with the separation between God and his people. 'This is my body, broken for you' he said. We do the same, breaking bread and sharing it among one another. A loaf whole and unbroken cannot feed people, it must be broken and shared and eaten for it to be of any good and for people to be fed and nourished.

We drink the wine to remember that Christ died and His blood was shed so that the sins of many might be forgiven. In doing all this we feel that wonderful peace of heart and mind brought about by the experience of reconciliation. Holy Communion is a special tradition known as a sacrament because it is more than a simple physical act of eating and drinking, it is what we do together and with one another in God's power and presence through his Holy Spirit and in Jesus' name.

The following week we remember again the anniversary of the Armistice on Remembrance Sunday. This time, we remember the sacrifice of so many, many human

lives and the shedding of blood in the Great War, the Second World War, and for all our veterans and service men and women, the conflicts in recent times, now and the threat of war which sadly is never far off.

Earlier this year, the Kirk Session confirmed its decision to have the service of Remembrance in the church at 11.20am, later than our usual 10.30am service so that all of us could be at the War Memorial at 11am for our Act of Remembrance and Wreath Laying with the rest of the community and we warmly invite all of our community, our civic leaders and veterans with their families to come into the church for the Service of Remembrance following this.

As the description of the Cottar's Saturday night draws to a close, we read the description of the parents' homage and prayers that Heaven's Eternal King would,

'For them and their little ones provide

But chiefly, in their hearts with Grace Divine preside'

In this month of remembering all that has been done in love for us, love both human and divine, I wish these same words and sentiment for you all.

May the Lord bless you and keep you

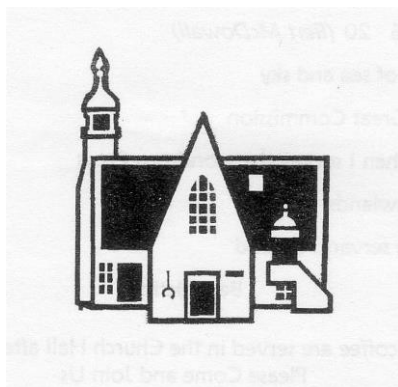

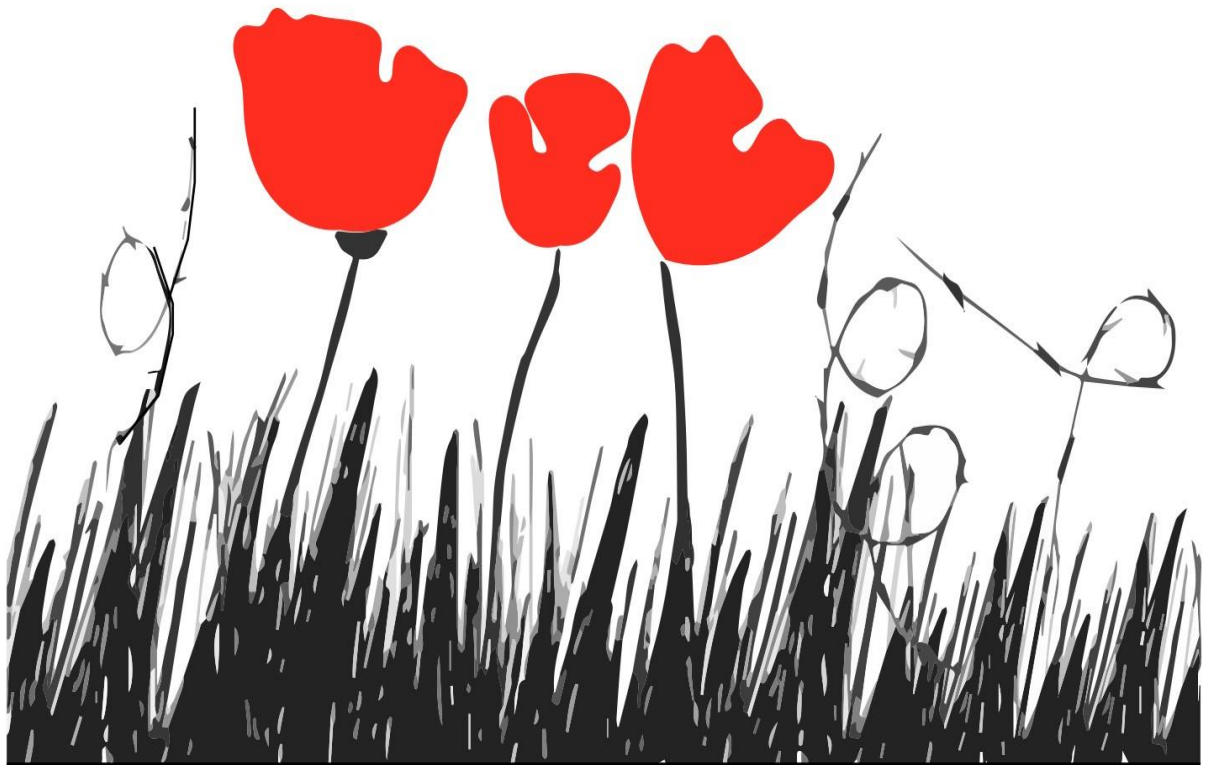

Remembrance Sunday

Remembrance Sunday is a national opportunity to remember the service and sacrifice of all those that have defended our freedoms and protected our way of life.

The War Memorial in Fenwick stands at the top of the village and was unveiled in 1921.

Initially it commemorated the thirty men of Fenwick parish who laid down their lives for home and country in the Great War; but they lived in the memory of those they left behind.

Sadly, following the Second World War a further 9 names had to be added to the Roll of Honour.

Today we remember all those whose lives have been changed by war and conflict and pray for peace in our world.

Please gather at the War memorial before 11 o'clock on Sunday the 12th of November for a short Act of Remembrance led by our Minister the Rev Kim Watt and the laying of wreaths. This will be followed by a Service in the Church at 11.20am to which a warm welcome is extended to members of the community, civic leaders, veterans and their families.

We have opened The Fenwick Church Hall, Paton Room as a Warm Space Café.

We will be opening every Tuesday between 12 -4 pm as a Community Cafe. The weather is getting colder and the cost of living is still rising. Fuel prices haven't gone down since last winter and that's tough. Reduced spending money means people are going out less and that leads to an increase in loneliness and isolation, particularly for people who live on their own.

Community is very important to all of us at Fenwick Church and we have this lovely, heated space to be used for the benefit of everyone. We are registered as a [Warm Space](#) and with an organisation called [Warm Welcome](#) to make sure we've thought of everything and are offering the right services.

At our Community Cafe there is no obligation to buy or do anything if you don't want to.

If you want to come in and read the paper or your book in peace, you're welcome. If you fancy a chat, our team are always happy to join in or to introduce you to other visitors. We have books, board games and crafting supplies that are free for you to enjoy. If you fancy a hot drink and a snack, we have tea, coffee and homemade soup and toasties available. There are cakes and biscuits you want a treat! We have free WiFi so you can come and work from home here if you like.

Everyone is very welcome to join us - we have plenty of space for pushchairs and buggies, and there's a changing table with free nappy-changing supplies always available in the Ladies toilets. There is also good wheelchair access.

We know it can be daunting for some people to come on their own but we want to reassure you that there will always be a warm welcome.

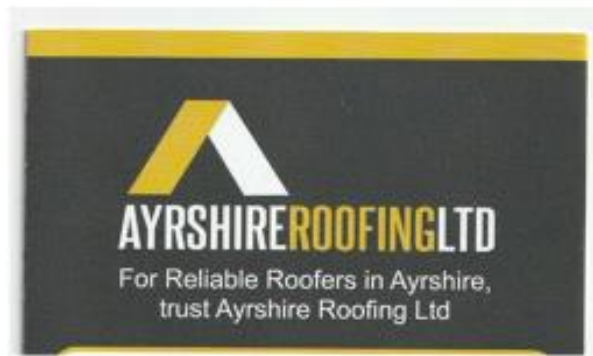
