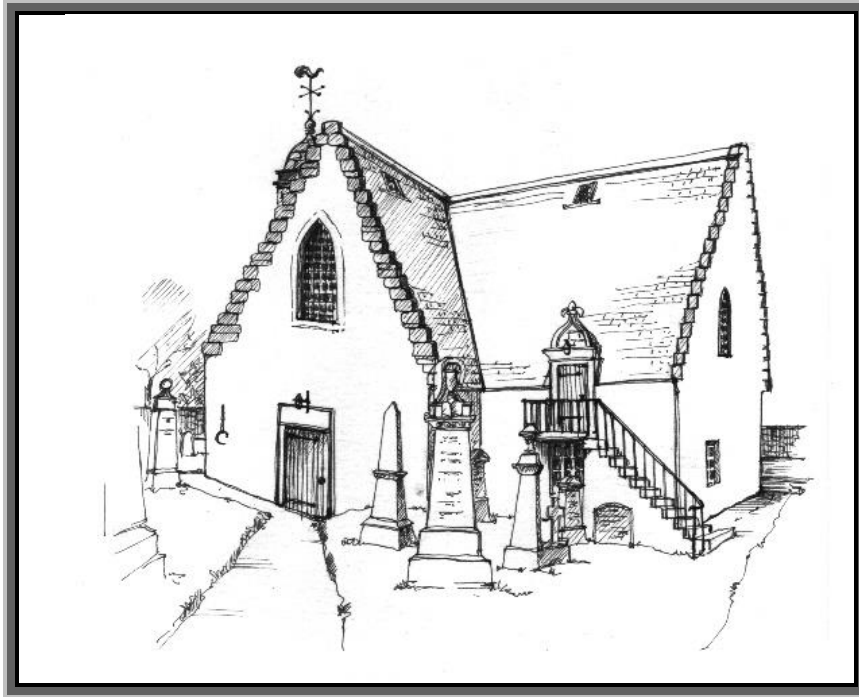

Dear Friends

May is the month of the meeting of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in Edinburgh. Once more, we are reminded that although we are the church in the parish, we are part of the national Church of Scotland. We may prefer to think of ourselves as the members of the beautiful wee white church with the distinctive crow stepped gables and the cross hidden high among the slates of the roof. The church, protected by the big stone walls and steeped in the history of the Covenanters who sleep in the kirkyard. We may be glad to belong to the congregation that gathers to faithfully worship God each week, that cares for the people of the parish and provides a space for folk to gather in friendship or shared interests. We may be glad that we have our distinctive Kirk Session to lead us and care for our spiritual and pastoral needs and at the same time, take on the responsibility for the governance of the activities of the church so that all is done properly and correctly. We may be glad that above all, we witness to Jesus' love in our lives and our belief in his message of salvation through our faith and service.

Yet, we do not do this alone for all over Scotland and beyond, there are busy parish churches and active and lively congregations just like ours but in different buildings and different communities. We are the national church, bound together by faith and worship and love. We belong. Wonderfully, we belong to an eternal kingdom too, far greater and more diverse than the national church, we have Jesus' assurance of this.

For now though, this is the month that the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland meets and elders, ministers and deacons from all over Scotland and beyond, along with invited guests from other countries and Christian faiths, from our Forces and hospital chaplains, our mission partners, young people and others gather to worship together and to debate the issues of the day. It is an amazing and memorable week, if exhausting!

This is what the Church of Scotland website has to say:

The General Assembly is the supreme court of the Church of Scotland. The Assembly meets annually to hear reports from the councils and committees, make laws and set the agenda for the national Church. The

Assembly was first held in 1560, the year of the Scottish Reformation which marked the beginning of the Protestant Church of Scotland.

The General Assembly is a significant annual event in the Church of Scotland calendar. Throughout the week, commissioners to the General Assembly examine the work and laws of the Church and make decisions that affect its future.

The Assembly does not shy away from discussing the big political topics of the day. In recent years the Assembly has received national and international attention for debating Brexit, same-sex relationships, the war in Syria, and fossil fuel divestment.

The General Assembly will take place from 18-23 May 2024 at the Assembly Hall on the Mound, Edinburgh. There is a public gallery where debates can be followed. It can also be viewed on line via the website. The moderator designate is Rev Dr Shaw James Paterson.

Prince Edward, the Duke of Edinburgh, has been appointed as the Lord High Commissioner to the 2024 General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, a decade after he last took on the role of royal representative at the annual gathering.

The Lord High Commissioner is the Sovereign's personal representative to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland and is appointed by His Majesty The King to attend proceedings on his behalf. On the opening morning, it becomes clear that this role is a serious one and not simply ceremonial for since the 1707 Act of Union, the distinctive presbyterian way of worship in Scotland has been protected and defended by the Sovereign.

This year marks the 25th anniversary of Devolution and the Scottish Parliament is to be presented with a bible by the Moderator to mark this anniversary. The bible is inscribed with the words which are also etched on the ceremonial mace which was presented by the late Queen Elizabeth. The mace is brought to the General Assembly each year and the words are Wisdom, Integrity, Justice, Compassion.

While our Christian way of worship does not have a monopoly on these words and their sentiment, they feature in scripture and remind us of the values and practice of our faith and church. In the Old Testament we read in the wisdom book of Proverbs, 'blessed are those who find

wisdom and gain understanding' and in the book of the prophet Micah, 'what does the Lord require of you? To act justly, and to love compassion'

In the New Testament, Jesus tells his disciples the story of the Good Samaritan, the neighbour who showed compassion and speaks to his followers about justice being found in the persistence of those who defended the poor and needy.

May is also the month of Christian Aid, the organisation which embodies the four words on the ceremonial mace and there is a concert in Kilmarnock to celebrate and raise funds for the work of Christian Aid, you can find more details about the concert elsewhere in the Covenanter.

This month, remember that our little church and faithful congregation belong to something much greater and that our love and service in the community is done in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ just as it is done the whole world over.

May the Lord bless you and keep you.

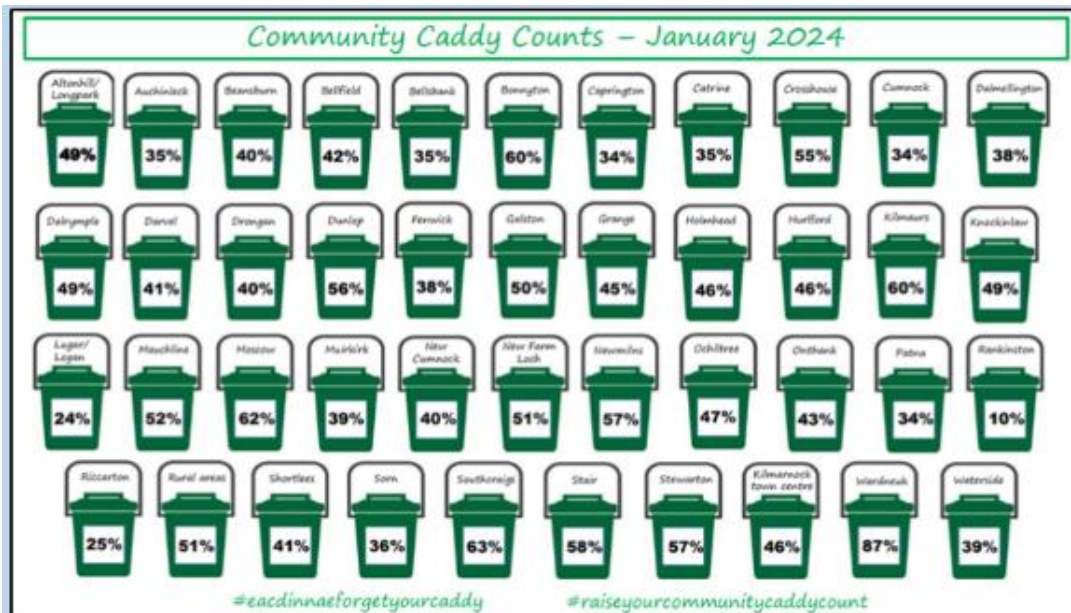
In Fenwick Primary we make sure we recycle, take care of plants and the teachers help us to learn about keeping healthy and we really don't like waste so we try and eat all our food. If you don't like the meal you get at lunchtime then you can always swap. We also try and recycle our food waste and East Ayrshire Council have provided us with food caddies.

We have a 'clean plate' checklist to see what meals are popular in school and those that are less popular to see if we need to change up the menu.

All families in Fenwick Primary have been encouraged to take part East Ayrshire's Food Recycling Initiative 'Dinnae forget your Caddy!' The aim of the programme is to raise awareness of the food items that can be recycled and encourage more families across East Ayrshire to recycle their food waste at home between February and June 2024. Everyone in Fenwick who has a food caddy that they put out for collection every week is given a token to put into 'Scrappy' our school caddy. Then each month we hold a prize draw and pick out a winner.

White cards – 1st Marilyn Morton; 2nd Graham Scott; booby Moira Young.

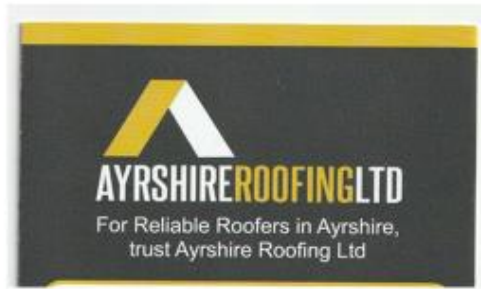
Marilyn thanked all those who had supported the whists by their attendance and bringing raffle prizes.

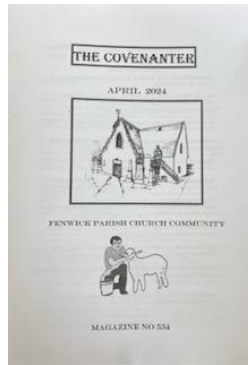

Excerpt from letter of thanks from Alan Kelly, Grants Manager at the Food Bank

In 2021, food parcels issued to local recipients totalled 1,975. By 2022 it was 2,967 – an increase of 50.2% Referrals remained at this level throughout 2023 and the first quarter of 2024.

Fenwick Parish Church has donated 964kg of food stock and essential household items and supported 138 individuals from East Ayrshire's communities with 3 days worth of nutritious food.
