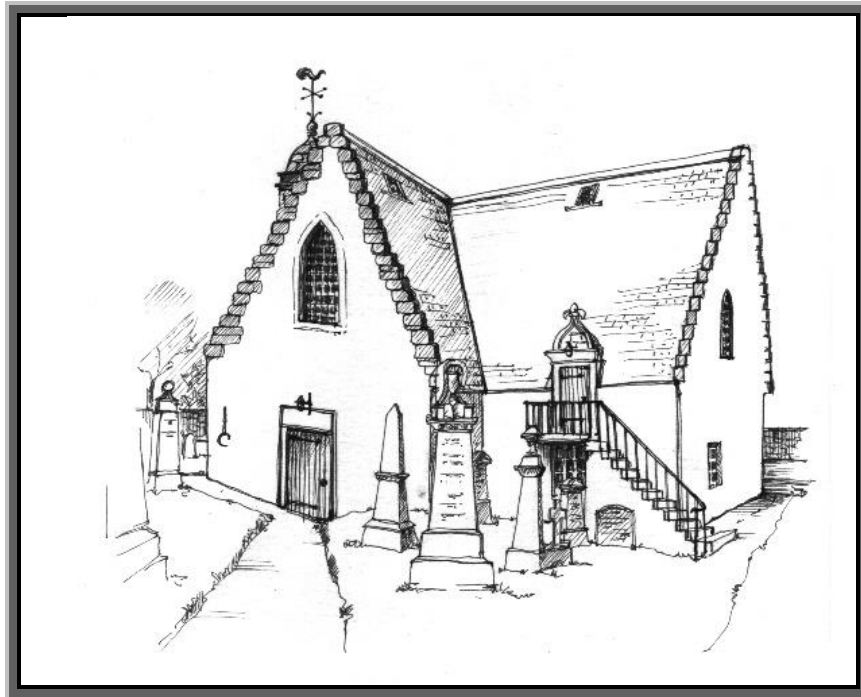

Dear Friends

From time to time, I am asked what I think about the relevance of the Old Testament in today's society and church life. Should we not concentrate our understanding on the teaching of Jesus Christ as we find in the four gospels and the mission teaching as found in the letters of St Paul the great evangelist? This is a question so worthy of a debate and discussion and this is probably not the place for it. I'd be ready to arrange a time and venue to consider the question in more detail.

I loved Old Testament Studies when I was at Highland Theological College in Dingwall! Our lecturer was the Rev Dr Hector Morrison, Rector of the college and in his soft west highland accent, he introduced us to the very beginnings of God's dealings with his people and the historical record of the creation of the world.

The Old Testament is known as the book of the Law and Prophets and the books of the Law are called the Pentateuch. I had been studying for some time before I actually went to Dingwall so I had to be there to hear the word said out loud by Hector and for me to know how to pronounce it! So if you want to know, it is penta-ch-as in chicken and oo-ch as in loch.

Jesus often quoted the prophets and the psalms in his teaching and the first place we hear him quote from the prophet Isaiah is in the synagogue. As we read in Matthew's gospel, he was quick to say that he came to fulfil the law and prophets. Jesus obeyed the Law and the instructions of the Prophets, but his deeper work on Earth is to fulfil them. Laws have purpose. In Old Testament times, the covenant laws given to his people by God were to condemn wrong living and lead the way to true life.

The law was fulfilled in Jesus' life, death and resurrection and the coming of the Holy Spirit, promised by Jesus, and given by God. We have just recently celebrated Pentacost. This is the coming of the Holy Spirit to the first disciples and the beginning of the church of which we are a part, many, many generations later. So to go back to the original question, I think that the Old Testament is very relevant!

It is full of stories of the relationship between God and the Israelite people and their relationships with their neighbours and each other. It is full of the stories of the consequences of their obedience and their disobedience. It tells of their repentance and turning back to God at the calling and entreaty of their leaders and their prophets. It is full of the history of our identity as a new generation of God's children, faithful or wayward.

It gives us the instructions for living and if you were a Kilmarnock Academy pupil or teacher, then you will know that the school motto on your blazer badge is taken from the words of the Old Testament prophet Micah where he says to the people,

'what does the Lord require of you? To do justice, love kindness (mercy) and walk humbly with your Lord.'

In her closing speech to the General Assembly last week, the outgoing moderator, the Rt Rev Sally Foster-Fulton spoke about the mission of the church in our time is to 'do justice', not debate what it is, not discuss it or write about it but to do it.

She spoke about the many congregations in Scotland who demonstrated their love and service by doing justice in many different ways; providing warm spaces in the cold, foodbanks for hungry families, visiting those who were imprisoned in their own homes by ill health or caring responsibilities and making worship services as accessible to people outside the church building as inside. We do all this for one another and we can do more yet!

If you were in church or watching the live stream the other week, you would hear Simon Young telling the story of Dr Peter Lovatt, who changed the lives of the small communities of Mali in North Africa by encouraging the exports of shea butter as an alternative to palm oil. He paid the women who crushed the shea palm nuts to extract the fat, found markets in the UK that would take and use the ingredient and in developing this cottage industry, made the lives of the small communities, sustainable and more prosperous, providing finance for healthcare and education.

As we look forward to all the events of the summer months, holidays, gala days, school leaver celebrations, special services and ordinary days in the garden and community, may we always be looking for ways to continue to 'do' justice, love kindness and walk humbly with our God.

I wish you many good times, good health and blessings over the summer.

May the Lord bless you and keep you.

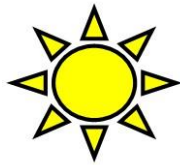

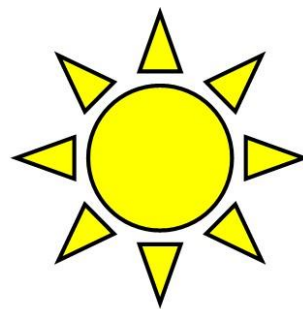

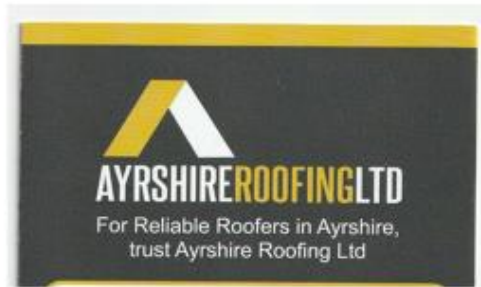
Fenwick Bowling Club

Donna Vivers, Chair of Fenwick Primary & ECC Parent Council, recently organised two launch events to kick start the planning for the schools' 150th Anniversary celebrations later this year.

Instead of just a few people planning what to do behind closed doors, Donna had the idea to open the doors of the local memorial hall to the community to generate ideas through a series of service design workshops.

All 137 pupils from Fenwick Primary School came over to the village hall throughout the day, along with parents and members of the community to participate together in some fun, but well-designed activities, designed to capture creative ideas for how to celebrate.

Donna and Zoe (P7) also visited the Warm Café in the Church Hall to talk to local residents and generate ideas which were added to a board throughout both sessions. These will now go on tour, and the top ideas will be available to the whole community to vote on the 8th June Gala Day and on social media.

From DJs to dressing-up, fireworks to fun days, bouncy castles to birds-eye photos, some overarching themes emerged – honouring the memories of the past while giving the current pupils their moment. Ultimately, bringing the community of Fenwick together.

Donna said: “As head of the Parent Council I had been discussing plans with the Head Teacher for the school’s 150th celebrations and suddenly realised we were doing it all wrong and coming up with solutions, whereas what we really needed to do was ask the community. I can’t wait to see how we can take all the creative ideas forward to plan the celebrations!”

Headteacher of Fenwick Primary Mr Houston said: “It was great to have Donna and Zoe help us with the workshops. This was a great way to bring our community together and we’re very grateful to SQA for allowing Donna to use her volunteering hours to help us”.

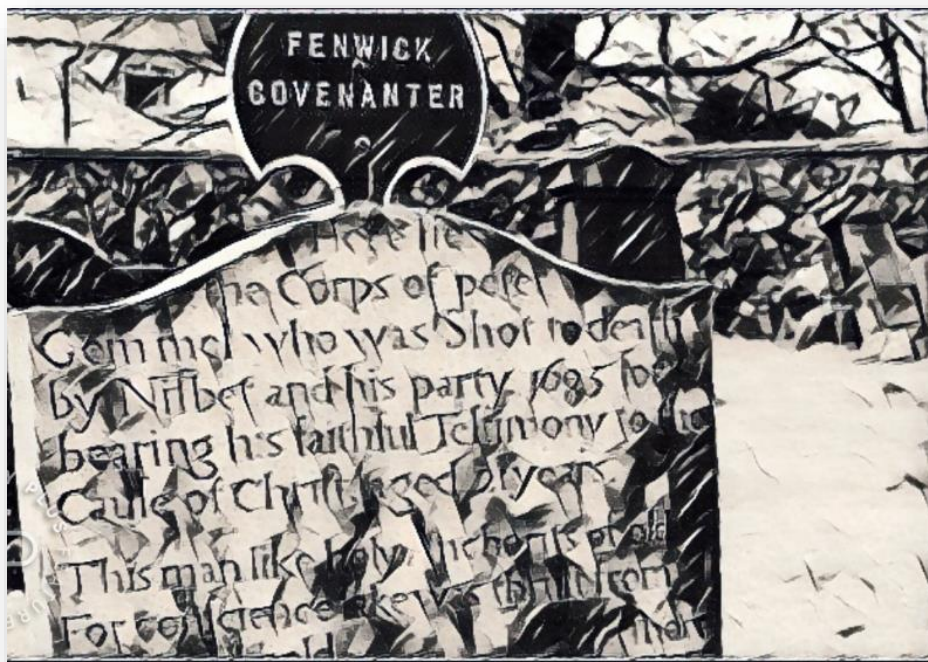
