A little reflection...

I am just back from a week's holiday down south of Stranraer near the Mull of Galloway. It was a great escape staying in a rural cottage, of dog walks in the stubble fields and along the beaches.

As we drove around I couldn't help notice the various churches and what seemed like complicated arrangements for service times. While out on a walk one day we stopped by Ardwell Church, a delightful building in the most pleasant rural setting, and got chatting to the Church Officer and all became clear. From Sandhead south all the way to the Mull of Galloway is two linked parishes. Within those parishes there used to be 6 places of worship. The chapel at Kirkmadrine ceased to be used some time ago and is now in the care of Historic Scotland and houses the Kirkmadrine Stones. The Church of Stoneykirk ceased to be used in 1974 as a place of worship and became an antique shop for some time. Sandhead has a timber building built about the time that Stoneykirk was closed and shares Sundays with Ardwell Church, that is to say alternative weeks in each building. Further South St Meddan's in Drummole has a weekly service except for the last Sundays of the summer months when worship is moved to the historic Church of Kirkmaiden. This ceased to be used as a regular place of worship some time ago but is in the care of a trust which maintains the building in good condition and opens it in the summer months. As we chatted to the Church Officer it became clear that Ardwell Church was likely to close as a place of worship in the not so distant future and some folk were already discussing forming a trust to look after its upkeep and open it as an occasional venue.

The reasons behind the closures and linking of the parishes are fairly obvious. They are found partly in the rural nature of the locality with a falling rural population and also in the general decline across Scotland of Church attendance. It is simply not viable for congregations and the church at large to maintain buildings where the numbers attending simply does not justify the upkeep of the building.

So why am I sharing this with you? What relevance does it have to Fenwick, the parish and the community? As I chatted to the Church Officer from Ardwell I couldn't help wondering, "What would happen to Fenwick Kirk should the congregation ever dwindle to a point where it simply was no longer sustainable?" Your first response might be one of indignation, "Surely the Church won't let that happen, it is an important historical building!" Yes it is an important building with a remarkable history and it undoubtedly has associations for many a local family: regular worship, Sunday School, school services, Baptism, Wedding or a funeral... these all leave the building with a place in our heart. The current status of the building of the Church in the Presbytery Plan is that it is an essential building. That status comes with no guarantees, and would certainly be reviewed if the congregation became unsustainable.

So if... and that “if” is certainly not today or tomorrow... Fenwick Kirk ceased to be a place of worship what would happen? I do believe that there is sufficient interest in the building within the community that it would not become an antique warehouse or converted into a restaurant or private dwelling. I think like Kirkmaiden and Ardwell a trust would be formed to take over the care of the building and to open it as an occasional venue. Phew! You might be thinking, the precious building would be saved! But is that really the extent of our vision for Fenwick Kirk? Yes, the building would likely be preserved but nothing of its life and worship and nothing of the faith that set its foundations in place all those years ago and sustained it over its life would be saved with it. Without that the building would become a dead shell, a memorial museum to what was, a quaint venue for a wedding, a concert or a funeral.

No! I would be far more radical than that! My belief is simple the future of the Fenwick Kirk is as a living breathing congregation whose life comes from each breath that is breathed within its walls in worship and the breath of God that infuses each life. The future presence of the Kirk is not about some trust being formed at some crisis point somewhere in its future. The future presence of the Kirk is assured now, today, by your action. I could appeal for money, that is always useful to offset the bills, but I won't. I appeal to you personally to make a difference. Come Sunday morning why don't you put on your shoes and open your door and come along to see what we are all about. It might sound a bit daunting but there is always a friendly person at the gate and there is a bunch of friendly folk inside too.

Can you come if you have never stepped inside a church before? Of course you can! Can you come with young children or not so young children in tow? Of course you can! Can you come if you used to come along but haven't been for a while? Of course you can, to be honest we have missed you! Can you come if your confidence has taken a knock, through illness or stress or something else? Of course you can! Can you come if you felt Church folk have been critical in the past? Of course you can... I know it's true and I know it is a difficult hurdle to cross but you will find the Kirk a different place these days. Can you come if you disagreed with a previous minister (or even me for that matter)? Of course you can! Can you come if you are not certain what all this religious mumbo jumbo is all about? Of course you can, there are no barriers to walking through the doors it is as simple as that.

Will you come and can we work together towards a bigger brighter vision for Fenwick Kirk that is far more than one of a cold empty building?

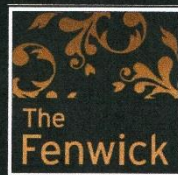
