Refreshing...

It was while I was thinking of another article for this magazine that I realised that The Covenanter reaches parts that no other magazine does! Each month with the exception of January and Summer breaks it is delivered to every household in Fenwick, Waterside and Moscow. It also goes to many of the farms in the parish as well a good few houses in Kilmarnock. The Covenanter is also available on our web page and I know it is read as far afield as the USA and New Zealand.

It would be an interesting statistic to find out exactly how many people read it. We know how many we print and we know how many are delivered. Of those deliveries we don't know how many folk pick it up and read it and how many people read each copy. Conversely I have no doubt that some of those copies delivered find themselves straight in the the recycling bin... of course if you are reading this that is not you! I do, however, know from comments I receive that it is picked up and read by many folk.

So it is that this humble magazine reaches parts no other magazine does! Of course it was an advert for Heinekin Lager that coined the phrase "Heinekin refreshes parts other beers cannot reach". How they justified the claim I don't know as any ice cold lager slips down easily on a hot day! To this day I don't know what parts they were claiming that that particular beer could refresh.

That said there is a part of us that is difficult to refresh and a part that we often fail to neglect. Our modern world focusses on self achievement and the discoveries of science and technology. There is no doubt that science and technology combine to make our lives easier and ill health more treatable but as we focus on those and on our personal achievements then we can quite simply lose sight of something far more fundamental. We are spiritual beings. We are created with a mind, body and soul. It is our souls that we more than often neglect to take care of.

Have you heard the term "soul weary" or have you yourself felt "soul weary"? That is that inner part of you crying out for refreshment. Folk seek to refresh their souls in the variety of ways. Some go for the adrenalin filled lifestyle. They live life on the edge with a thrill a minute but mistake the adrenalin rush for refreshment. Others find themselves in the arts whether by listening to music, enjoying the aesthetics of a painting or sculpture or by participating in arts and crafts. There is some peace to be found here in the slowing down and contemplating. Others still will head for the freedom of Eastern meditation or the order and ritual of some religions. Here to is some solace and peace.

Others will head on the destructive path of alcohol or drugs seeking to find peace in oblivion. There are other paths we tread to in order to seek some refreshment for a dry soul, the pursuit of wealth, power and relationships (some very fleeting) are but some.

Jesus talks of himself as living water. To those gathered for one of the great feasts in Jerusalem he said “Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them”. In a more intimate conversation with the Samaritan woman at the well he said, “Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life.” Her story is worth reading in full as she was certainly one with a weary soul, you can find it in John chapter 4. The point is this, Jesus was saying that he was the refreshment that reaches the parts that no other refreshment can. Jesus is the antidote for our parched souls.

I would note here that this is not about the rituals of religion. While some find some solace in their structure and perhaps quiet in contemplation the rituals do not provide the answer we seek. Only Jesus does. The answer to the dryness in our souls is a simple faith believing in Jesus and what he came to do for you.

Shrove Tuesday is just around the corner with pancakes, syrup, sugar and lemon juice or however you choose to serve your pancakes. Pancake day itself heralds Ash Wednesday and the start of Lent. A period of 6 Sundays which traditionally were a time of prayerful reflection and personal preparation for the great feast and celebration of Easter. A day in the Church’s calendar marking the triumph of Jesus over the grave and of his saving work in the life of those who choose to believe.

So here is an idea this Lent. Why not set aside a little bit of time to read one of the Gospel accounts. The Gospel of John is not a bad place to start. Just read a small section each day and reflect on the passage and what it might mean (or not mean) to your life. If you don’t have a Bible you can find the text at biblegateway.com (choose something like the New International version or New Living Translation). Failing that ask me and I’ll lend you a Bible. Try it for 6 weeks and see where it takes you might be pleasantly surprised and surprisingly refreshed.

A persistent problem

Picking up on the adage that this magazine reaches the parts others cannot reach many of you will be unaware of the stamash that is brewing on the “Friends of Fenwick” Facebook page. It seems that the subject that is annoying folk the most is the issue of dog fouling around the streets and environs of Fenwick. Responsible dog owners (those who pick up after their pooches) and non dog owners alike are joining together and condemning the few dog owners who seem to think it is perfectly alright not to pick up after their pet after it has defecated in a public area. An awareness campaign is about to begin and that is likely to be followed up by reporting of those who continue to offend.

There seems to be a few hot spots... Main Road (top and bottom), the road from Waterslap though to Raith Road, the playing fields, the grass around the play park (and even within the children’s play park), Maunsheugh Road and the old slip road. I would also add the redundant fields at the end of the old slip road and east of the cemetery - folk may think of these as “out in the country” but a number of folk walk around these and children play there as well.

It is not acceptable to leave dog faeces lying in any of these areas or indeed anywhere where anybody else may frequent or on any agricultural land.

First and foremost, owners are legally required to pick up after their dogs and dispose of the bagged waste responsibly i.e. in a bin not over a hedge! Owners who don’t can be fined. There are good reasons for this: Dog faeces left in the open are a health risk to humans and to other animals and the risk remains long after the faeces have weathered away. Dog faeces are an accumulative eyesore. Accumulative because most dogs are creatures of habit and defecate in the same area. It is also unpleasant, it is simply not nice to tread in dog faeces or push a buggy through it and then have to deal with the subsequent mess and possibly the trail through the house.

You might be reading this and thinking that you are not part of the problem... you are if you own a dog and don’t pick up after it. There is no excuse, quality free dog bags are available at the shops in Fenwick. Additional waste bins are also about to be installed around the village.

The message is simple **GRAB IT, BAG IT, BIN IT!**

It is time to put an end to this blight on our village, lets keep Fenwick beautiful

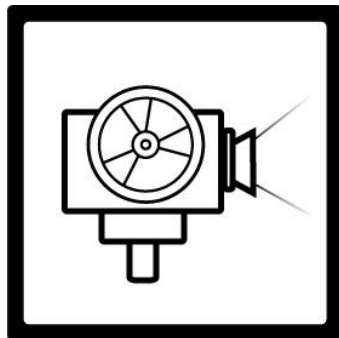

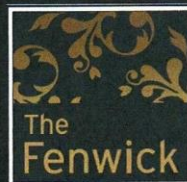

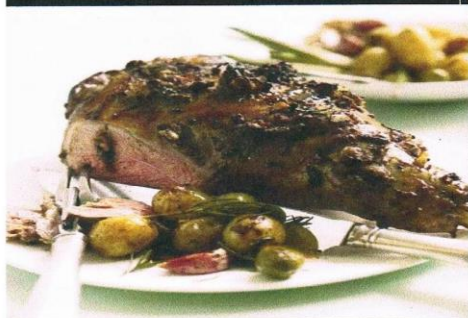
