Dear Friends,

During the October holidays Laura and I spent 6 nights in Barcelona. We were able to visit some of the more famous sights including the Parc Guell and the Sagrada Familia, which were both designed by the famous Catalonian architect Antoni Gaudi (1852 – 1926). We also saw from the outside a number of other buildings that he had designed.

Although he designed many famous buildings he is particularly remembered for the Sagrada Familia, the Church of the Holy Family. Work began on the Basilica in 1882 and Gaudi was commissioned a year later when the original architect resigned. Initially he also worked on a number of other projects, but from 1915 until his death in 1926 he devoted himself solely to work on the Sagrada. When he died it was less than 25% complete. Work has continued according to his plans but came to a halt because of the Spanish Civil War and progressed very slowly for many years. It is anticipated that it will be finished in 2026 to coincide with the centenary of Gaudi's death.

Gaudi was a deeply spiritual man with a great love for both of God's Word and his creation, both of which he incorporated into the design of the Sagrada Familia. The building really is stunning. Photographs don't do it justice. You really need to see it for yourself to even begin to appreciate its beauty and majesty. There are many amazing features, but his understanding of colour and light and how to make the most of them with the positioning, shaping and the stained glass have an incredible effect. Many of the visitors (including us) were taking photographs of the effect of standing where the light was shining on them.

That reminded me of the Apostle John's encouragement to his readers in his first epistle: "This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live in the truth. But if we walk in the light as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus purifies us from all sin." (1 John 1:4-7)

As people stood in the light shining into the Sagrada Familia their appearance was physically transformed. As we come into the light of God, and learn to walk in the light our character will be transformed into his likeness. May we experience that to be true in our lives and may his light be reflected from us into the lives of others.

FENWICK COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Fenwick Community Council met on 10th October. We were pleased to welcome Cllr. McFadzean; Cllr. Jenkins; Louise Hughes, Community Worker and 4 members of the public to the meeting.

The police reported a speeding offence on Skernieland Road and vandalism to a door handle in Raith Road. Our Locality Policing Team is based in Galston and covers Galston, Newmilns, Darvel, Hurford, Crookedholm, Moscow, Waterside and Fenwick. There is no direct dial to the team and all non-urgent incidents should be reported by calling 101. Sgt. Wallace encouraged residents to report anything at all suspicious in the area.

The Dogs Trust Event, held in conjunction with Home Energy Scotland and the Community Health Improvement Partnership on 15th September, was well supported and the Dogs Trust are keen to make this an annual event. 23 dogs received a free health check and 3 dogs were microchipped. Jacquie Flannery from Home Energy Scotland was on hand to offer energy saving advice. A free home energy assessment can be arranged by giving Jacquie a call on 01292 521896. The C.H.I.P. team were also kept busy with residents taking advantage of free health assessments and lifestyle advice. The C.H.I.P van will be back in Fenwick on 15th November, Main Road, 9.30am -10.30am for anyone looking for further advice and support. Please note that free dog waste bags are again available from McFadzean's garage.

The school wall surrounding the store next to the entrance to the KGV Playing Field is in a poor state of repair and is scheduled for replacement next year. We hope that repairs to the KGV entrance can be tied in with this to create an attractive entrance to the park.

Unfortunately, we have had little success in engaging Ayrshire Roads Alliance and we have asked our Councillors to take this up on our behalf, with speed restrictions being dealt with as a priority. There are still a number of outstanding issues from our community meeting with ARA in June 2017 and we are trying hard to progress these.

Of the £20k contribution from Mansell Homes, £15k was allocated to the Knockinlaw Community Garden project and we are making enquiries about the other £5k which is still held by EAC. The proceeds from the sale of land at Skernieland went to the Housing Account and were used to finance the capital investment programme in the year received.

We have now received confirmation that the second appeal against the refusal of planning permission for Glenouther Renewable Energy Park has been dismissed by the Reporter.

Our next meeting will be held on Wednesday 14th November and will incorporate our AGM.

FENWICK COMMUNITY ACTION PLAN

The Community Action Plan information event was held in the John Fulton Hall on Saturday 13th October. The event was facilitated by Louise Hughes who will guide the process of community consultation leading to the production of our new action plan. As well as providing information, the aim was to form a village steering group to lead the development on the new plan. Louise is delighted to confirm that 17 residents, representing a wide cross section of the community, have signed up to get involved. The group will meet soon to produce a questionnaire which will be distributed to all households within the community and which will be used to gather local opinion and establish the priorities for Fenwick for the next five years.

LIGHT UP FENWICK

We have continued to make great progress over recent months with funds raised now standing at just over £10,550. We are most grateful to Fenwick Golf Club for most generously sponsoring a lamp post and again we wish to express our sincere thanks to everyone who has contributed to date. We have received a grant of £1,600 from East Ayrshire Council towards the costs of erecting the lights and the switch-on event, taking our bank balance to the amazing figure of £12,156.11. The lights are now on order and planning for the switch-on event is well under way.

We have more than 90 households registered to decorate and light up a window for the Christmas Window Walk, expertly organised by Corrinne Taylor. The map of participants will be on display at various planned events and there will be a further opportunity to add your home if you would like to join in and decorate a window for the big day. Pop up “Light up Fenwick” cards will also be on sale. These are a must have for the parade on 1st December and make a great alternative to a Christmas card for friends and family. Craft workshops, helping the children to make lanterns and window decorations, are being held with the Fenwick Primary School, Brownies and Guides, Boys Brigade and the Breakfast Club. Primary 6 will also be visiting Hallhouse Nursing Home to get involved in crafting activities with the residents. Drop in craft workshops for anyone interested in getting ideas or help are being held at the Fulton Hall, 12pm-2pm on 27th October and 10am -12pm on 10th November. No need to book, just come along. You can also check out details on the new Facebook page “Fenwick Christmas Window Walk”.

Doors will be open at the Fulton Hall from 4.30pm on Saturday 1st December, and we would ask that anyone wishing to join the lantern parade from the Fulton Hall meets there from 4.45pm. The parade will leave the hall at 5.05pm (avoiding the southbound no. 4 bus) and progress to the tree where the Gala Day Squire and Lady-in-Waiting will switch on the Christmas tree lights. There will be entertainment and communal singing, after which we will return to the Fulton Hall for seasonal refreshments. Maps will be provided for the Christmas Window Walk and residents and friends can carry on the evening wandering the village at their leisure to view the decorated windows. A minibus will be available for anyone who would find it difficult to complete the journey on foot. Full details, posters and further information will be available nearer the time.
