Dear Friends,

Happy New Year!

Perhaps this year, more than most, presents us with opportunities and challenges. As a family it will be a significant year for us. Anna will graduate from University this summer. Laura and I celebrate our Pearl Anniversary (30 years) in July, although we suspect that may be somewhat overshadowed by Anna and Matthew's wedding which will be the same week (although into August).

As a nation we face many uncertainties and new challenges as we enter uncharted territory. The same is true for the church, and elsewhere in the Torch you will find a report on the recent Presbytery Planning meetings. We do not like having to contemplate such drastic action, but whether we like it or not, that is the position that we are in. I have addressed some of the issues with the Kirk Session, but feel it is important to do in my letters.

As I have said before in other contexts, that while we have to face up to the reality of the situation, we must also remember the reality of God's promises. I am reminded of the promise that God made to King Solomon after the dedication of the Temple: "When I shut up the heavens so that there is no rain, or command locusts to devour the land or send a plague among my people, if my people who are called by my name will humble themselves and pray and seek my face, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land."

In a recent sermon I quoted from Emma Stark of the Glasgow Prophetic Centre who said that as a nation we are walking in God's merciful judgement.* I believe that also applies to the church. We have chosen to go our own way, God has allowed us to do so, and we are experiencing the consequences. God's purpose is to bring us to that place of humility where we acknowledge our complete dependence on him, that we should start taking his word seriously again, that we should turn back to him, and that we should experience the blessings promised to King Solomon.

God has moved in our land many times in the past, and not just in Scotland, but in many other places throughout the world. During the Cornish Revival God touched many people and brought them under conviction of their need for salvation which could only come through the blood of the Lord Jesus Christ. William Haslam, who was powerfully anointed of God, tells of going to a meeting that was so packed with strangers who just kept coming that he couldn't get in the door and had to climb through a window and stand on a table.

There have been so many moves of God throughout history where a church that looks to be dying out has been restored and where the moral climate of society has been transformed. It happens when God's people, who are called by his name, humble themselves, pray and seek his face.

We do see so much that could discourage us and make us fearful for the future, both in the church and in society. Let us not ignore the difficulties and challenges we see around us, but let us also hold onto the words of Jeremiah as he contemplated the devastation of Jerusalem: “Because of the LORD’s great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. I say to myself, ‘The LORD is my portion; therefore I will wait for him.’”

May we each know the reality of that truth and experience God’s blessing in 2019.

FENWICK COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Fenwick Community Council met on Wednesday 9th January 2019. We were pleased to welcome Cllr. Freely; Stewart Turner, Head of Roads, Ayrshire Roads Alliance and 15 members of the public to the meeting. For the period of December the Police reported a road traffic accident in Kirkton Place where the driver failed to stop or report to the Police and an incident of assault in Weaver's Court. In both cases, enquiries continue. Stewart Turner explained his role as Head of Roads for East and South Ayrshire and welcomed questions from those present. A number of issues were raised including white lining, speed monitoring and restrictions, Cemetery and Mansell road adoption and drainage, parking survey results/selfish parking, accompanied road inspections in the village, tourist signage, condition of the pavement outside Jessie's shop, safe access to the cycle path/X77 and the extension of pavements and street lighting on Stewarton Road. An action plan has now been produced and progress will be monitored by the Community Council.

The issue of dog fouling was again raised. Please note the following extract from East Ayrshire Council's website. "If you see dog fouling in a public area, please report it to Environmental Health - contact details provided below. If possible, please give the name and address of the offender, or a description of the owner and dog."

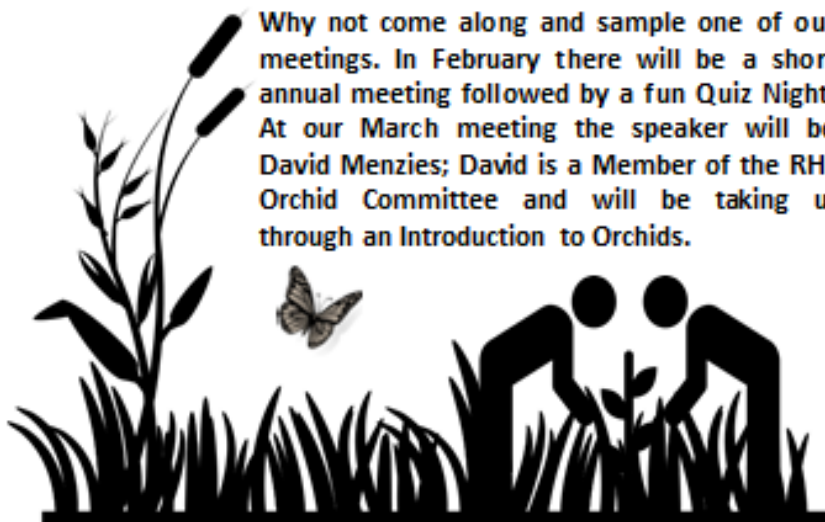
