Dear Friends

I am scheduled to preach in Strichen and New Pitsligo on Sunday 30th August, so by the time you read this I will hopefully be clearer of the timescale of things. When the legislation was passed in July allowing the use of the internet I really had anticipated that we would have moved by now. I find myself in a strange position having already sent out a letter telling you of my departure but still not yet able to say my farewells. All I can do is reiterate my thanks for your continued support during this time.

Although the wait and the uncertainty of when things will happen has been very frustrating I appreciate that there are many people whose lives have been far more seriously affected than mine. I certainly don't want to trivialise the devastating consequences our current situation has had on some people but it has forced all of us to reassess our lives to some degree.

In his circular letter to the various churches of his time the Apostle Peter described his readers as "strangers in the world". He reminded them that they were only passing through on the way to their eternal destination. He reminded them of the living hope that was theirs through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

He writes "In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. These have come so that your faith – of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire - may be proved genuine and may result in praise, glory and honour when Jesus Christ is revealed." Take time to read through 1 Peter chapter 1 and to reflect on these things.

I'm reminded of the words from the song *When it's all been said and done* sung by Robin Mark:

I will always sing Your praise
Here on earth and ever after
For You've shown me Heaven's my true home
When it's all been said and done.

FENWICK COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Hello everyone. We hope you are all safe and well in these strange and difficult times.

The Community Council last met on 12th February 2020 and as yet, due to current restrictions, we have no plans in place for our next meeting.

So, what has been happening?

The Light up Fenwick Family Ceilidh/Dance planned for Saturday 14th March was a sellout. A last-minute decision was taken on the morning of the event to cancel which, unquestionably, proved to be the right decision. Thank you to all who were supporting us for your understanding and special thanks to Ian Calderwood, George Lambie and Rough Cut who were to be our musicians for the evening. Here's hoping we can plan another event at some point in the future, even if that may still be some way away.

The launch of our Community Action Plan was planned for 27th March. Wisely, with hindsight, the decision was taken on 13th March to cancel the launch and to move forward with a digital launch only. The Community Action Plan 2020-2025 has since been published on Friends of Fenwick Facebook page and is available on the East Ayrshire Council website. We hope that hard copies will be made available soon. The Action Plan belongs to us all and we very much hope that you will take time to get to know the document and the village priorities and, most importantly, get involved.

We would like to say a very special thank you for all the wonderful volunteers who got involved in "Fenwick Cares" where every household in the Community was offered the support of a buddy during lockdown. There are many examples of practical help in getting shopping and prescriptions, telephone befriending and new friendships being made. This was such a fantastic example of our Community coming together in a time of need and very real evidence of our Community spirit and resilience. As we move forward, we hope to embrace this energy in working together to make Fenwick an even better place to live.

Although not directly associated with the Community Council, it seems appropriate to recognise the weekly "Clap for Key Workers and the NHS" here. For many this was the highlight of the week during lockdown and it was great to see so many out on the streets or in their gardens clapping, dancing and singing along.

The award for best slosh must surely go to the residents of Rysland Drive and the amazing support for the key workers at Hallhouse Care Home from Laigh Fenwick deserves special mention too. None of this could have happened without the outstanding efforts of Cllr. McFadzean, Jamie Ballantine and Susan McFadzean who provided music week after week. In the main the weather was kind to us and the rain on the final evening didn't stop an amazing finale with Roughcut taking the stage (or pavement) to belt out some great tunes. Well done everybody, and especially well done to all of our key workers you are amazing!

Our plans for VE Day on 8th May changed too. The celebrations we had planned for the Fulton Hall clearly could not happen, but Fenwick rose to the occasion with garden tea parties, decorated houses and music of the time very kindly played around the village by John and Susan McFadzean. Our thanks to them and to Anita Cox, Ingrid Sampson, Robin Waddell and Lesley Hamilton who were leading our plans for the event in association with the Church. A special mention to Anita who put an enormous amount of time and effort into producing a film of wartime footage which focuses on how lives were lived in Scotland during the war years. The film was funded by East Ayrshire Council and we look forward to showing it on an appropriate future date.

The first stage of Community involvement in the preparation of the East Ayrshire Council Local Development Plan 2 kicked off with the publication of the Main Issues Report in early June. A total of six sites were put forward for potential development in Fenwick/ Public consultation on this document ran until 31st July with the Community Council being awarded an extension for comment until 14th August. The information was widely shared on Facebook and our understanding is that there was a substantial response to the consultation from local residents. The Community Council's views have been submitted along with our comments about the difficulty we had in being able to reach the views of those in our Community who do not have access to technology, particularly as many of these residents were in the shielding category. Overall, we believe we have submitted a fair and robust response in representing the views of the village. There will be further opportunity to comment when the proposed LDP is published in autumn next year. That's all for now. Keep well and stay safe.

Church of Scotland Assessment ‘Tool’ for individual and group health risks

As lockdown eases we have to continue to be mindful of the rules, advice and guidance from Government and other statutory and voluntary organisations. We will be continuing to work towards opening the Church buildings for worship and other activities as soon as it is safe and practical to do so. The undernoted Personal Risk Assessment, issued by the Church of Scotland, may be helpful to you in deciding what activities you can safely resume. You will not be required to tell anyone what your personal score is and we will be aiming to make all Church activities as safe as possible.

The assessment ‘tool’ below helps you to see how different risk factors may combine to give serious health complications should you catch the COVID-19 virus. It does not include the factors that may make you clinically extremely vulnerable, where you should be following the guidance for those who are ‘shielding’. It includes the factors where there is significant statistical evidence but does not include any rarer conditions which you may have, so this only offers a starting point. You may want to discuss the results with your doctor or with those who have expectations about your involvement with church life. We are not claiming medical expertise in sharing this way of scoring your risk but giving a way to show how serious catching the virus may be for you or the groups using your church building(s). And add up your score.

A score of under 3 indicates a lower risk, but you should still be following the guidance for staying safe.

A score of 3-5 suggests a greater risk and you should consider ways of reducing your risk by taking additional precautions or avoiding some activities.

A score of 6 or more suggests a high risk and indicates that you should continue to work or participate in church life from your home.

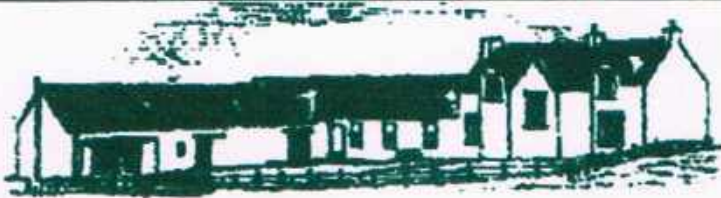

ZOOM~HOW TO GUIDE!

Many activities and social events are happening virtually now and using software that most of us had never even heard of a few months ago. It can be really daunting the first time you are invited to attend something using Zoom, so here is a little guide to get you started!

This guide has been produced as part of the Families Wellbeing project funded by the Scottish Government Wellbeing Fund.

JOINING A ZOOM VIDEO CALL

- Many people send out the link to the session via an email which will include a meeting ID and a password.
- Sometimes the link is on a social media page, or sent to you as a message
- When it comes to the time to join you can either go to the original invite/email and click on the Join in Zoom meeting link or you can go to zoom.us in your internet browser and put in your meeting ID and password.
- If you don't already have Zoom installed it will either give you a link to download it or it will automatically download it for you. It only takes a few minutes.
- The app will ask you for your name, which will be visible throughout the call. Some people use nicknames but be mindful not to cause offence when choosing your name. You can change it during the session too.
- Once you have done this, you will be taken directly to the session or to a waiting room where you will receive a message saying that the host will let you in soon.

HANDY TIPS FOR DURING THE MEETING

- The best way to see everyone in the meeting is to have gallery view set, otherwise you will only see the person talking. You can set gallery view at the top right hand corner of your screen. This option is not available on mobile phones or tablets.
- To turn your microphone on and off click on the microphone icon.
- To temporarily unmute yourself press and hold the space bar. As soon as you release the space bar your microphone will be muted again.
- To turn your camera on or off click the start/stop video camera icon. Sometimes if the internet connection is not great it can help if people turn off their video for a bit.
- It is also possible to have your camera on so others see you, but you don't see yourself. To do this move the mouse over your picture and three little dots will appear. Click on them to see the option to hide view from self – click on that and your picture will disappear from your screen but others will still see you.
- You can also write messages to each other during a call on Zoom. To write a message click on the little speech bubble. You can choose to write a message to everyone in the call, or choose 1 person and send them a private message. If someone posts a message you will get notification on the chat icon, like you would if you get a new message, just click on it to read it.
- The little people icon on the tool bar will show you all the participants in the video call.
- To leave the session click on end.
