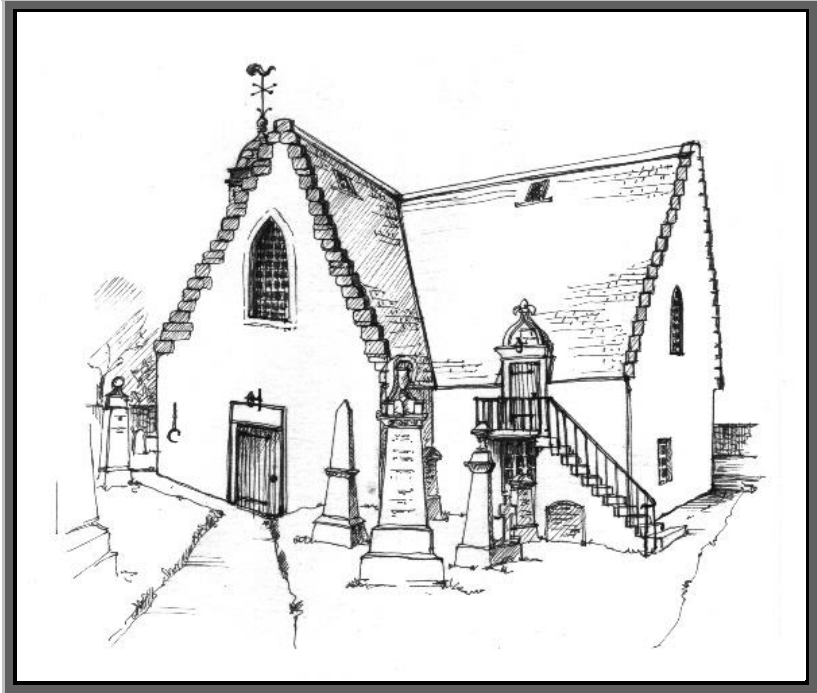

Dear Friends

These have been the saddest of days as we remember with love and affection, our late Queen Elizabeth who died at her beloved Balmoral Castle on the 8th September. We knew her as our Queen, some of you remember her as a princess, most of us knew her as a wife, a mother, and a grannie. So many people have said over these last days that she was the grannie of the nation, she was everyone's grannie. She was a woman less ordinary than most, yet loved and cherished by many. Most of us have never known another Monarch and seldom, if ever before have we been faced with such a profound and permanent change in our shared lives.

She was a woman of great faith, sharing her Christian Faith with the nation and beyond, perhaps we remember this most from her Christmas Day broadcasts when she spoke of her hope in Jesus Christ her Lord and Saviour and she spoke with conviction and humility. Her life was one of devotion to duty, service to her people and witness to her Lord.

In these last days we have heard of so many memories of encounters with the Queen, some very entertaining, some deeply moving, all memorable and we will cherish and treasure all these memories.

I listened to the First Minister, Nicola Sturgeon speak of when she first saw the Queen as a nine year old in Irvine going with her Mum to see Queen Elizabeth officially open the Magnum Leisure Centre. I smiled for I was there too! All the Scouts and Guides in the area were invited to line the route around the Magnum and as Scout Leaders with the 51st Ayrshire Bouthreehill Relief Church Scouts in those days, Alistair and I were both at the side of the path with our Scouts as she came past.

In these last days too, we have honoured and remembered this remarkable woman whose faith, hope, love and duty shone from her all the days of her 70 years as our Monarch and from even before that. However you have done this, quietly as you watched TV, in families, with friends, in the communities of farms and Moscov, Waterside and Fenwick, or gathering in Edinburgh, Dumfries or other Royal residences, these are times that we will not forget.

As we watched all the astonishing pomp and ceremony of her state funeral we marvel again at the pouring out of love and regard, the sense of respect and honour with which she was held, the devotion and duty of all who directed and took part in any aspect of the day, the simply beauty of the flowers adorning her coffin with their deep meaning of love, strength and remembrance and we have a sense of gratitude for our place together with one another in this land and the nations and realms of the Commonwealth.

Our hearts went out to the King and all his family as their grief took second place to the late Queen's state funeral but was no less felt by them, to the Royal Households, to all who served in any way yesterday, perhaps especially the Bearer Party with their so very precious responsibility. This day was an extraordinary day in the life of our nation and it was a great blessing to us to live in her era.

Now we have a sense of a new beginning in the continuity of our lives together. We have watched the meeting of the Privy Council and the Accession Ceremony, we have sung the National Anthem with new and unfamiliar words on our lips and picture in our minds, we have prayed for the strength and sustaining of our new King and as National Mourning ends, we turn once more to take a new path on our national journey remembering the faithfulness of the Lord, His unfailing and everlasting love and his renewing us each morning.

Here is the prayer that we prayed together in the church the day after the death of Queen Elizabeth, may you find comfort and strength in it:

Living and Loving God

We take strength and comfort from all your mighty promises

The strong words written by those who experienced your faithfulness

Those who bore testimony to your sustaining and share with us their assurance

You have given us more than words for you have given us Jesus Christ

Who is himself your message and presence

Your comfort and hope

You have given us your Holy Spirit, the Great Comforter

Who assured us of your promises

You give us grace to help us in times of sadness and trouble

Great is your faithfulness.

Amen

May God bless you and keep you.
