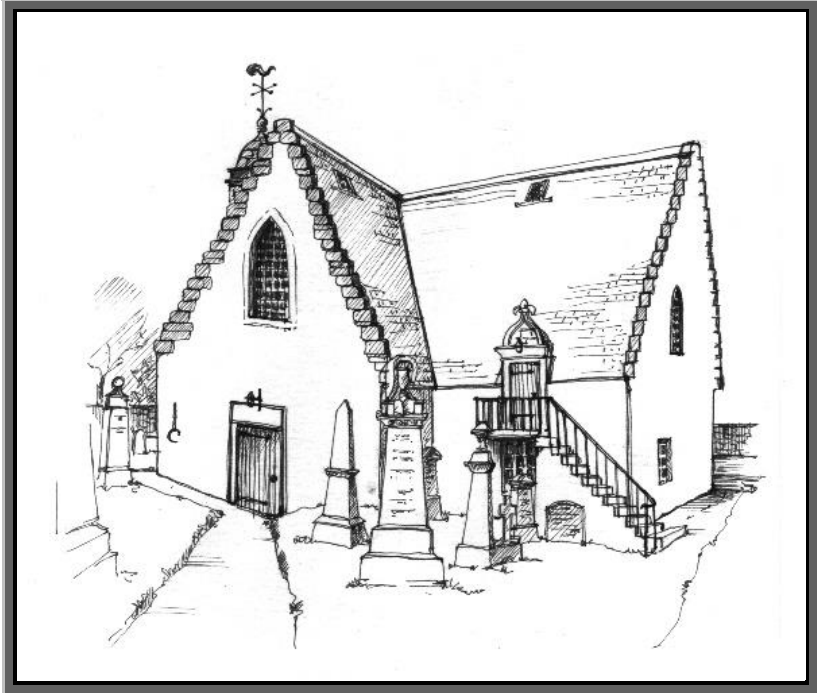

Dear Friends

May you all know the blessings of God's presence with you in this New Year. I'd like to begin by saying thank you to all of you who sent lovely good wishes, greetings and cards at Christmas time. It may seem a while ago now but Alistair and I much appreciated your warm thoughtfulness.

Now I have a request of you, those of you who are handy with a darning needle! I have a bag of knitted blanket squares and wonder if any of you would like to take the bag and put the squares together to make a cosy blanket. I'd be delighted to pass them on to someone or a group who would be happy to sew them together. They are a real mixture of sizes but I'm confident that there are folks out there who could make something warm and useful out of the bag of squares. Then together we can find a home for the blanket, perhaps Hallhouse or another suggestion. I like a work of cooperation and in progress, so please do get in touch.

In these short winter days and long evenings, we so miss the daylight and look forward to any signs to reassure us that the days will lengthen and flowers and leaves will reappear. There is a lovely hymn in our hymn book, the words written by Samuel Longfellow an American clergyman and hymn writer who lived in the nineteenth century. The hymn is 'Tis winter now':

'Tis winter now, the fallen snow
Has left the world all coldly clear
Through leafless boughs, the sharp wind blow
And all the earth lies dead and drear.

And yet God's love is not withdrawn
His life within the keen air breathes
His beauty paints the crimson dawn
And clothes each branch with glittering wreaths'

I was reminded of the words of the hymn last week when I was out in the garden one morning filling the bird feeders yet again. It was during the particularly frosty cold weather yet the garden was lit up with low sunlight and the very glittering wreaths mentioned in the hymn.

Samuel Longfellow's hymn finishes with the reassurance that God's warmly enfolds us in his love and keeps us through life's wintry days.

God enfolds us with love in the love and care of others and there are so many others. Family, parents, spouses, siblings, children and grandchildren.

We have our pets and friends, colleagues and neighbours, shopkeeper and carers, and even strangers we meet along the way. Just as the knitted squares can be made into a blanket which, when wrapped around us will keep us warm and protected from the cold, so all of these people together become the knitted blanket of God's care for us and surround us with colour, warmth and love to brighten our days.

May God bless you and keep you.

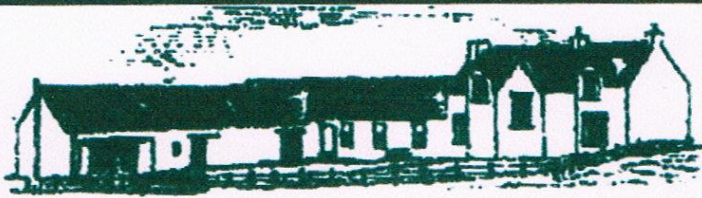

Reflecting on 2022, it has been an incredible year for the Fenwick Striders. Membership has continued to increase and has never been so popular. Little did we know that when the group started on a cold wet October evening in 2017 that we would evolve into a group that is now known nationally as well as building a reputation for being the most welcoming and supportive of running groups for all.

The Fenwick Striders won the overall jog Scotland team prize at the Kilmaurs 5km and won the third male team prize at the Helensburgh 10km. We have an amazing mix of individuals of all abilities, ages and genders, with every one of our members achieving their own personal goals.

To Celebrate everyone's success in 2022 The Striders held their Christmas party at the Fenwick Bowling Club, this was a fantastic evening that everyone enjoyed, and we are planning on continuing this for years to come.

Looking ahead for 2023, training has already started in earnest, Coach Anji has already devised the training schedules for her group with the Fenwick ladies entering a team relay for the Allan Scally races & the Manchester marathon. The Fenwick Striders have also entered a number of events, Manchester marathon, London marathon, Rotterdam marathon, Great North Run ½ marathon, Great Scottish run ½ marathon, Killie “Roon the Toon” 10km, etc. We wish everyone well with their personal goals.

It is well known that physical activity has a profoundly positive effect on our bodies, and it is generally accepted that if you feel physically fit and healthy then you are more likely to feel more confident, have more energy and have a more optimistic view on life. 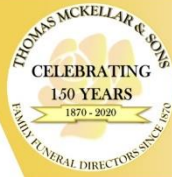
