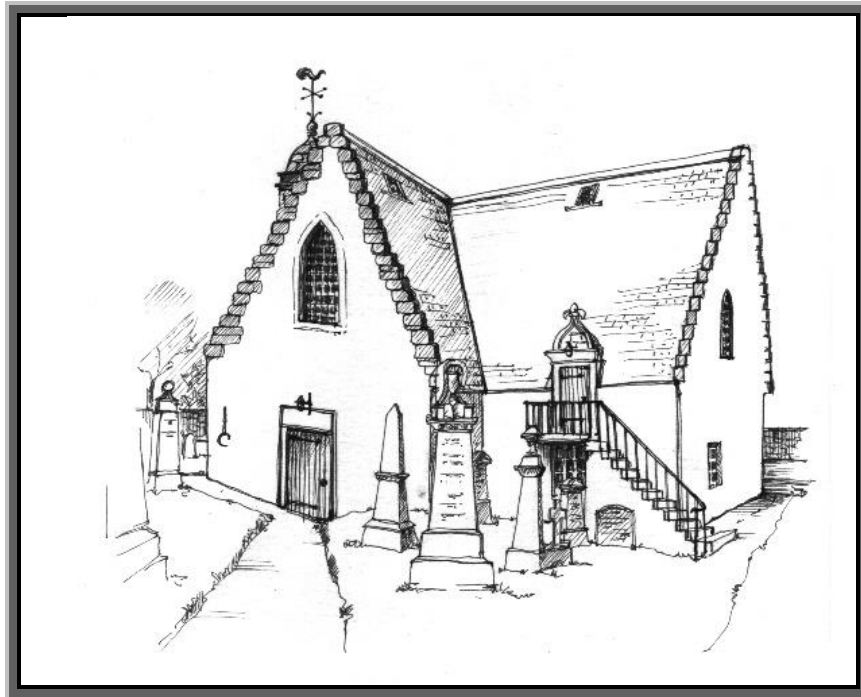

Minister's Letter

Dear Friends

I wish you all a happy and healthy new year and I want to thank you for the good wishes, encouraging, kind words and lovely cards which we received at Christmas time.

Now, that time of celebration has gone past and in church life, this is the season of Epiphany and before this month of February is out, we will be in the season of Lent. In the time between Christmas and Easter, many churches and congregations, ours included, will study and reflect on all of Jesus' human life with us.

In Luke's Gospel, we find the story of Jesus in the synagogue at Nazareth, the place where he had been brought up and was known by the community. On that particular day, he stood up to read and read from the book of the prophet Isaiah. Luke describes how he unrolled the scroll and found the place where Isaiah had written:

'The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach

good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners
and recovery of sight for the blind.

To release the oppressed

To proclaim the year of the Lord's favour"

And then he looked around and told the people, 'today, this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing'.

This event is often referred to as Jesus 'Nazareth Manifesto'. This is his purpose, his statement of intent. He doesn't say that he has come to save the world, instead, he drills down into human feelings and the

human situation. Immediately, people related to him because he was talking about where they were as ordinary citizens and because they knew who he was, he was Joseph's son.

In this year of general election and political upheaval, we will probably hear the word manifesto more than once. What will be the purpose and intent of our member of parliament? What will be the purpose and intent of our political parties? In the last weeks we have witnessed national outrage at the injustices and suffering of the postmasters and postmistresses of the UK who had charges of dishonesty brought against them. This had been an ongoing situation but it took a TV drama before most of us paused or paid attention and only then was there the promise of remedial action across the whole UK at the highest level.

Injustice is about fact and truth, the notion of unfairness is how we feel and perhaps the reason that Jesus quoted the prophets and psalms and told parables and stories to those who gathered to hear him was because of the truth of the words and the power of stories to move people, the power to make people feel the same feelings as the people of which he spoke. We still tell the same stories that Jesus told and they are still powerful.

Later this year, the congregation will host a story telling event and these stories will have the power to make us feel as well as hear the stories and so we look forward to that.

At the beginning of February, on Monday 5th at 7.30, we will be hosting a visit from Fiona Kendall, our missionary partner who works for the organisation Mediterranean Hope (mediterraneanhope.com) supporting displaced people who are washed up from illegal sea crossings on the island of Lampedusa and those who come to Italy through international humanitarian corridors, seeking safety from torture, imprisonment and oppression. There is no doubt that the stories of her work will capture our attention and make us more aware of people who escape dark and difficult situations and find new opportunities with Mediterranean Hope, a stepping stone to a safer more secure life for their children and themselves. Please come along to this meeting and support Fiona.

There is a lot to be said for ordinary settled lives with no drama and there are times when we remember to pray to God in gratitude for what we are spared, in gladness for what we have and at the same time bringing before God those we know and don't know who are feeling the burden of ill health, other difficulties and perhaps injustice too. For many this year, there will be drama, at home, at work, in politics, with family, friends and loved ones. What is certain is that even in all our discomfort and struggles, nothing can separate us from God's love for us to be found in trusting Jesus Christ and his Nazareth Manifesto.

May God bless you and keep you.

Fiona Kendall Mission Partner of the Presbytery of the South West

Fiona Kendall, who is a Church of Scotland Mission Partner with the Mediterranean Hope project, will be back in Scotland and visiting our presbytery during February.

She will be the guest speaker at Fenwick Church on Monday 5th February at 7.30pm and then again at the meeting of the Friendship Club of Kay Park Church on Thursday, 8 February, at 2 p.m.

An invitation is extended to everyone who is concerned about the plight of migrants who risk the dangerous passage across the Mediterranean Sea in overcrowded boats.

Mediterranean Hope was established after a shipwreck in October 2013 when, a few miles from the Italian island of Lampedusa, 368 people died in the attempt to reach Italy across the Mediterranean Sea. The charity is funded by the Federation of Protestant Churches in Italy and supported by churches in other countries. It supports migrants with applications for protection, provision for their basic needs and social activities, while also campaigning for safe and legal pathways for migrants and raising awareness of issues of social justice, human rights and discrimination.

John Macmillan, formerly of Fenwick and now living in Fife was set apart as a reader in the Church of Scotland at a moving service at St John's Parish Church in Cupar, Fife on Tuesday 28th November. As well as family and friends, Rev Kim, Rev Geoff and Sharon Redmayne, also formerly of Fenwick were able to go to the service which was live streamed on the evening for those unable to travel. John was a lively and faithful member, elder and Session Clerk at Fenwick for many years.

We are delighted that John is preaching at Fenwick Church on Sunday 4th February.
