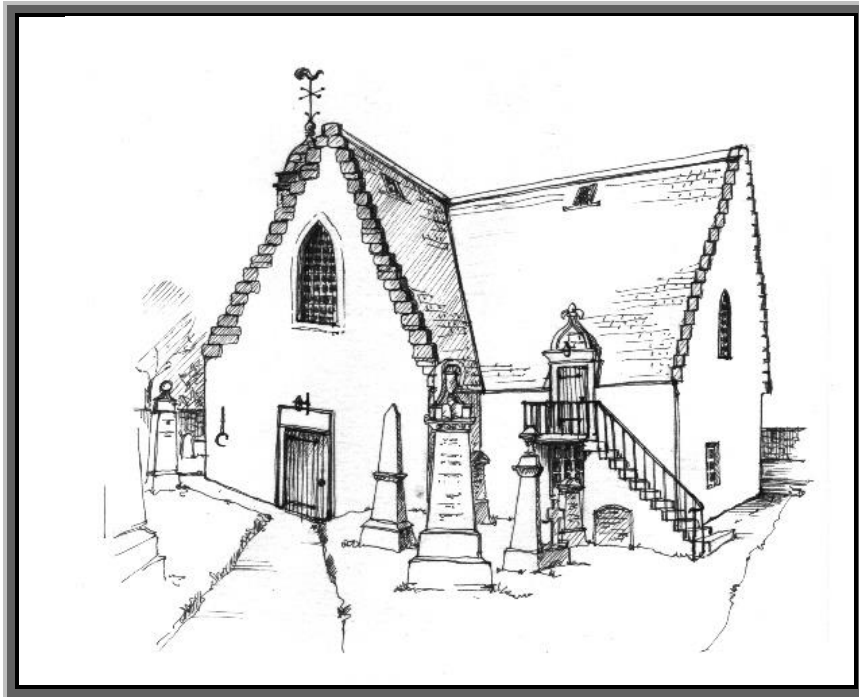

Minister's Letter

Dear Friends

Last week in church, I asked the folks in church what gave them cause for hope, what kinds of things restored and nurtured hope. The results of the energetic discussion included things like lighter days, sunshine, snowdrops, daffodils, hugs, company and faith. I had been talking about a house in Glen Lochy, just north of Tyndrum where for several weeks each winter, the house and garden are in the shadow of the mountains. The sun is low in the sky on the south side of the range and that part of the glen remains gloomy until a few days into February when the sun rises high enough to send sunbeams over the mountain tops and into the glen, flooding the house and garden with often snowy sunshine for the first time that year. How lovely it must be for the people who live in the house to see the sun shining in their windows and lighting up the rooms within and the garden outside.

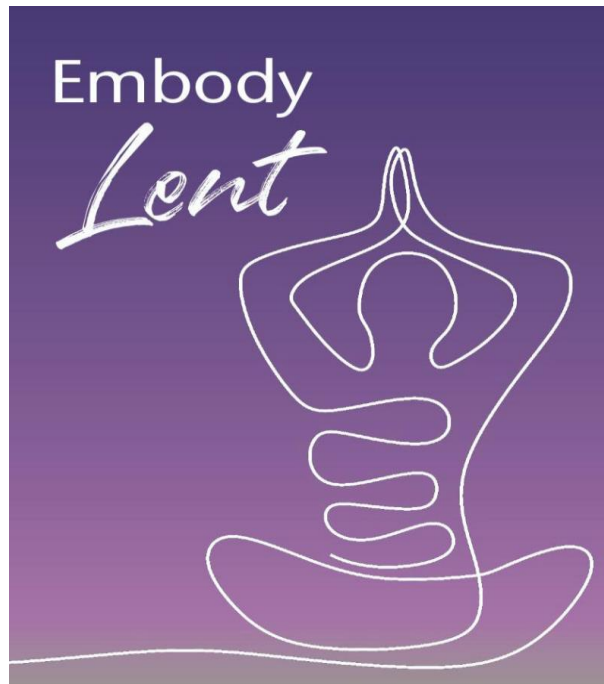
As we have turned our thoughts towards this season of Lent, we have been reflecting on how we are created flesh and body as well as mind and intellect. They are not separate and as the psalmist reminds us, we are fearfully and wonderfully made to feel and think and move. We embody our faith and hope as we use our feet and hands, voice and senses to move and worship God in praise, prayer and reflection.

In the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, we find the different accounts of the baptism of Jesus, the physical presence of the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove and the voice of God confirming that Jesus is his Son. In the space of a paragraph of scripture, we see confirmed our Christian beliefs of the identity of Jesus as the Messiah, the mystery of the Trinity of God in Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and the very physical sacrament of baptism as a commitment to God.

When we come or we bring our children for baptism with water, it is a very embodied and physical event, which we call a sacrament. This confirms our commitment to our faith in God as our heavenly Father and our hope in the saving grace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Now, as we are in the season of Lent, we think once more about the embodiment of our faith in the days ahead. It is the season for self

examination and reflection and these are emotional and intellectual activities. For many it is a time of emotional and physical discipline in the act of self denial or commitment to use this season in the giving away of that most precious of possessions, our time.



Thursday mornings in March – The Church Hall 10 – 11am

This year, I encourage you to try out our 'Embody Lent' sessions for an hour on Thursday mornings in the church hall or on Wednesday evenings in the kitchen at Stewarton. We are going to be working through the book 'Embody Lent in 29 Yoga Postures' by Pauline Steenberger, who is a minister in our presbytery, so please get in touch with me if you are interested in trying this. Each posture can be practised on a chair as well as on a mat so please don't be put off by the thought of getting down on to the floor! This is an opportunity to explore scripture in a very different way from the usual intellectual exercise. It might be a bit of a challenge, but definitely worth it as we grow together in grace.

We have learned by experience that where the body goes, the mind will follow, so if we resolve to practice hope and encourage others to do the same, we find that hopefulness becomes a way of being as well as a way of thinking. In our world, there are many who struggle with the most unbearable circumstances and we see this each day in our papers and

in the media. We can hope and pray for resilience and comfort for each adult and child who seems to the world to be without hope. The apostle Paul told the little Roman Christian community who so badly needed encouragement, 'be joyful in hope, patient in affliction and faithful in prayer'. We can follow their lead, especially in being faithful in prayer as we ask God to bring comfort to those who need this so very much.

After the days of remembering all that Jesus suffered in our place, at the very end of March, Easter comes upon us bringing the very best kind of hope, the hope of resurrection, and living in the eternal kingdom where there will be no more pain, tears. We stand gathered together before the throne of the Lord and we are encouraged by the scripture from Hebrews 11: v1 'Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen'

As the sunshine and light of Easter dawns on us after the gloomy days and shadows of the Cross, may we celebrate with hands and hearts and voices and with all our soul and strength.

May God bless and keep you all through this season of Lent to Easter and always.

On Monday 5th February, Fiona Kendall, our Mission Partner visited the church and gave a presentation on her work with Mediterranean Hope which is an organisation which helps people fleeing from other countries. The organisation – a humanitarian and social project - was set up by the Protestant churches in Italy in 2014 after realising the inadequacies of any institutional response to the problem.

Visitors and local ministers joined the gathering as Fiona described the work which is happening on the island of Lampedusa near Sicily. Lampedusa was the scene of many deaths on the night of the 3rd October 2013. At least 368 people died and their corpses were found floating in the sea. The sight shocked the world.

Hearing and seeing Fiona's presentation, it was hard not to be affected by what was and is happening. Mediterranean Hope provides practical

help to the boat people who have come from all over not just North Africa. There are people fleeing the Taliban, some who have left the war in Ukraine as well as those trying to get to safety from the wars and unrest in the Middle East.

We saw photos of the immigrants arriving with only the clothes on their backs, minus shoes. They are met with an offer of shelter and food. While plans are in place to move the survivors to different camps, at Lampedusa, they are offered help with applications for visas, training for jobs and art and music therapy to help relieve the trauma of what has happened to them.

It is humbling to see how the helpers at Lampedusa show Christianity in action. Our Guild and other organisations raise money for Mediterranean Hope.

John McMillan's visit

On 4th February, John McMillan formerly of Fenwick and our fellow parishioner led our church service. He reminded us that it was 11 years since he and his family had left the village. He now lives with his wife, Caroline, in Fife. Former friends and neighbours came to support John in his new calling as a Reader in the Church of Scotland.

John's theme for the service was "Have you not known, have you not heard?" He talked of the strong village ethos and the history of our forefathers, the Covenanters, and 400 years of the love of God in Fenwick.

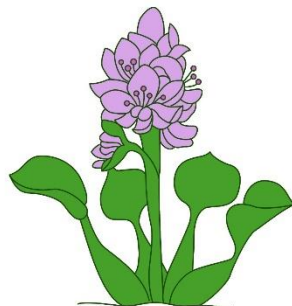
The Club is looking for a new Secretary and help is needed to keep the Club an active and welcoming organisation.
